


Euratom indirect actions – nuclear fusion and fission research

- Lisbon and Gothenburg ambitious agendas:
 - economic development with sustainability and social cohesion;
 - Need to bring about change while at the same time reinforcing core values and respecting diversity;
 - Need to reinforce EU competitiveness while at the same time developing new types of international relations with our partners

The Socio-economic Sciences and Humanities Theme operates across these objectives:

- by supporting research and related activities aimed at providing the basis for policy development but also improving insight and understanding of the key underlying trends and the factors driving them
- at the service of other Community policies, measuring and assessing impacts; providing inputs to increase their overall consistency and coherence and improving our knowledge base in these fields

- The Citizen in the EU ("Citizenship")



New Calls for 2009 just published

- 3 new SSH Calls just published on September 3
- Calls close on January 13, 17:00 Brussels time
- Call A focuses on collaborative projects,
 Call B on Specific International
 Cooperation Actions, Call C on
 Coordination and Support actions



Main aspects

- Work Programme 2009 is a logic complement of the first Call 2007 – 2008: consistent with the Specific Programme, corresponding to urgent scientific and future policy needs.
- All the Activities are covered; the challenges are multidisciplinary and they request integration of all the disciplines in a balanced way (economic, social, cultural, political); quantitative and qualitative approaches are requested.
- Emphasis on: the international / global dimension,
 humanities, methods of analysis and assessment, foresight.



Main aspects

- Support to EU Policies: ERA, Lisbon, Sustainable Development, Renewed Social Agenda, Cohesion, Security, Cultural Interactions, European Citizenship...
- International cooperation is strengthened.
- Communication is subject of intensive efforts.





Activity 1: Growth, employment and competitiveness in a knowledge society

Key aspects:

- Changing role of knowledge throughout the economy (different types of knowledge and competences, education, lifelong learning, intangible investment)
- Economic structures, structural change and productivity issues (role of the services sector, finance, demographics, demand and the processes of long-term change)
- Institutional and policy questions
 (macroeconomic policy, labour markets, institutional contexts, policy coherence and coordination)
- New challenges and opportunities from globalisation, emerging economies, relocation, and EU enlargement.

Activity 2: Combining economic, social and environmental objectives in a European perspective: Paths towards sustainable development

Two interrelated issues:

- How socio-economic models have fared in combining the objectives, the conditions under which this occurred including the role of dialogue, social partnership, institutional change
- Economic cohesion between regions and regional development in an enlarged EU;
 Social cohesion as well as its relation to social problems

Trade-offs or synergies between the economic, social, environmental objectives in a world context, spatial aspects, long-term sustainability, and issues for developing countries will be addressed within these issues.

Activity 3: Major trends in society and their implications

Three major trends:

- Demographic change including ageing, fertility and migration.
 Broad societal and economic implications, including active ageing and effects on pensions systems
- Changes in aspects of lifestyles, families, work, consumption, health and quality of life
- Cultural interactions in an international perspective including traditions from different societies, diversity of populations, differing identities, language and religious practices, possible relation to discrimination, racism, xenophobia and intolerance

Activity 4: Europe in the world

- Understand changing interactions and interdependencies between world regions including emerging and developing regions and their implications for the regions concerned, especially for Europe, and the related issue of addressing emerging threats and risks in a world context and their connection to human rights, freedoms and wellbeing.
 - Flows of trade, finance, investment, migration and their impact; uneven development, poverty and sustainability; economic and political relations, global governance including international institutions. This will explore cultural interactions including media and religions and distinctive non-European approaches.
 - Conflicts, their causes and resolution, and fostering peace; the relation between security and destabilising factors such as poverty, crime, environmental degradation, resource scarcity, uneven development, financial instability and debt; terrorism, its causes and consequences; security-related policies and perceptions of insecurity and civil-military relations.

Activity 5: The Citizen in the European Union

Two main strands:

- Participation (including of youth), representation, accountability and legitimacy; the European public sphere, media and democracy; various forms of governance in the EU and policy processes; the role of civil society; citizenship and rights; related values of the population.
- European diversities and commonalities, including their historical origins and evolution; differences in institutions; cultural heritage; various visions and perspectives for European integration including the views of the populations; identities; approaches to multiple coexisting cultures; the role of language, the arts and religions; attitudes and values

'Ideas' Programme – ERC (European Research Council)

- Proposals and funding areas are curiosity-driven and « bottom-up »; funding support across all areas, including Socio-economic sciences and Humanities
- Budget 2007-2013: 7.5 billion euros (+/- 10-15% for SSH)
- Funding directed to <u>individual teams</u> and projects selected solely on the criteria of excellence
- No pre-defined research agenda but 5 specific ERC panels dealing with SSH themes (1. Individuals and Organisations, 2. Institutions, behaviour, values and beliefs, 3. The human mind and its complexity, 4. Cultures and cultural diversity, 5. The study of the past and of cultural artefacts)





'Capacities' Programme Research Infrastructures

- Under SSH the Research Infrastructure concept covers mainly "soft" tools (databases, IT tools and methodologies, data archives etc).
- 6 significant RI projects in SSH in the final ESFRI Roadmap, adopted on October 19, 2006:
 - CESSDA (Council of Eur. Social Science Data Archives)
 - CLARIN (Common Language Resources and Techno- Infrastr.)
 - DARIAH (Digital Research Infrastr. for the Arts and Human.)
 - EROHS (Eur. Observatory for the Human and Social Sciences)
 - ESS (the European Social Survey)
 - SHARE (Survey of Health, Ageing and Retirement in Europe





People / IRSES

- Increased researchers' mobility for career development, word-wide
- Declared interest by non EU countries to increase exchange of researchers with EU
- Problem of "brain drain": traditional fellowships contain a high risk of "no-return" (particularly to less attractive economies)
- EU policy to increase international RTD cooperation
- Interest to enhance sustainable cooperation between research organisations





Remarks on outcome of first 2 rounds

- For each activity, at least one "structuring approach" will be developed around major issues. "Project Clusters" will be managed in a coordinated way in order to get a "critical mass" relevant for policy making /more visibility for results
- Foresight more important than only one "Activity": all the activities will undertake foresight exercises in particular Activity 2, Activity 1, Activity 3 and Activity 4 as well as "Indicators".
- SEVENTH FRAMEWORK PROGRAMME

Communication and exploitation of results will play a major role and are already a "corner stone" for the grant agreement negotiations.



Projects selected address broadly major EU Challenges

Examples of EU challenges addressed by the 2007 - 2009 projects/topics:

- Lisbon agenda, including the next phase of the strategy (post 2010); knowledge economy and society, evaluation of policies, education.
- Support to ERA: economics of innovation systems, entrepreneurship.
- Globalization: role of EU; impact on regions, behavior of firms; geopolitics; international trade; human rights; climate social issues.





Quantitative and qualitative approaches

- All the disciplines are present in a balanced way: economic, social, humanities, policy; they are integrated to address multidisciplinary issues.
- Both quantitative and qualitative approaches / methods are used; particular emphasis on data bases (mainly social but also industrial and economics); at least 10 data bases will be developed through the first call!



Global European, national, regional, local dimensions are treated.



Project Clusters (as considered by the Commission services)

- Cluster 1: Globalization and knowledge economy, evaluation of EU policies
- Cluster 2: Intangible investments, service-oriented economy and macroeconomic policies
- Cluster 3: Sustainable development and regional development (rural and urban)
- Cluster 4: Demographic changes and migrations





Project Clusters (as considered by the Commission services)

- Cluster 5: Social cohesion and youth integration
- Cluster 6: Governance, security, conflicts, peace and human rights
- Cluster 7: Citizenship, identity and culture
- Cluster 8: Emerging and horizontal issues, dissemination and international cooperation
